Vice President and Dean of Academic Affairs, George Timmons reported:

 Update on the faculty searchers – Science, Business, Fine Arts and Construction Technology are all in the final stages. Finalists have been selected and recommendations have been submitted for the Dean's consideration.

The Office of Academic Affairs is excited to highlight a few of the major accomplishments for the semester:

- Beginning in the Spring of 2020 the College's course schedule has been completely revised. The purpose of the change is to promote student success and enhance the faculty work environment.
- As part of the Dean of Academic Affairs onboarding process, he has met with all direct reports, faculty, and key staff that work in collaboration with the office.
- The purpose of the one-on-one meetings were to gain insight into what faculty and staff saw as areas of strengths and opportunity for CGCC. In addition, the meetings are a foundational step in establishing relationships with faculty and staff.



- Efforts have been taken to enhance CGCC's relationship with the K-12 community. Dean Timmons and/or staff has met with the Hudson area Superintendents, and the Principal of Hudson High School.
- The Office of Academic Affairs collaborated with faculty to development a transparent process for faculty who perform compensated additional duties. The implementation of the new process will begin July.
- The College has selected an assessment software that will move the institution to its next level of excellence with regards to assessing student learning and be instrumental in the preparation for the Middle States Accreditation visit.

Recognition of end of year celebrations:

- Celebration of Excellence is a recognition event for in students in the College in the High school Program that have excelled academically. This year we had 125 students who qualified and received certificates, followed by a reception.
- Associate Professors Barbie Shaffer and Berne Bendel took several of students to the SUNY
 Undergraduate Research Conference held at SUNY Adirondack on April 26. Students who
 enrolled in SL113- Research Methods for the Behavioral Sciences during the fall semester, had
 the opportunity to conduct original research that engaged them in the research process from
 conceptualization to analysis.
- Dawn DeFino held a wonderful event called Community First in partnership with COARC that allow students with special needs participate in activities on CGCC's campus and recognizes their achievements.
- Other end of the year signature events included the Nursing Pinning Ceremony and the induction ceremonies of Alpha Sigma Lambda and Phi Theta Kappa.
