- We presently have 12 senators for Student Senate.
- Election of officers for Student Senate will be this Thursday.
- Women's Soccer Team is 1 in 5. They play Tompkins-Cortland tomorrow.
- Women's Soccer goalie, Keegan Deyo is Nationally Ranked
- Athletic workshops all went well

10. Vice President's Report

Vice President and Dean of Administration, Dianne Topple reported:

- Dean Topple presented her report at the Finance meeting, prior to this meeting. Vice President and Dean of Academic Affairs, George Timmons reported:
 - Due to enrollment challenges the Toyota T-TEN program is being restructured. The College is working with the leadership of Toyota T-TEN program to explore solutions that will position C-GCC for sustainability.
 - Academic affairs had a successful launch to the semester. Dr. Estrella-Luna who holds a Ph.D. in Law and Social Policy from Northeastern University gave a very thought-provoking presentation on implicit bias and microaggressions. That led to an active conversation about creating a culture of equity, inclusion, and belonging. I received several positive comments from faculty and staff regarding Dr. Luna's delivery of a sensitive topic.
 - The Faculty meeting was productive and informative. We invited Cynthia Proctor, Director of Communication and Academic Policy Development from the SUNY Provost Office who will help launch C-GCC's micro-credentialing initiative.

A SUNY micro-credential is:

- 1. Competency-based, reflecting skills and competencies mastered;
- 2. Endorsed by the issuing institution as a whole;
- 3. Developed through local faculty governance processes; and
- 4. Meaningful and of high quality, with learning standards, assessments, and clear documentation of skills mastered that have meaning beyond one classroom, one program or the institution. Students can use a SUNY micro-credential to share their expertise to prospective employers, those hiring for internship opportunities, and to other academic institutions.

Ad-Hoc Committee has been created, with the specific tasks of creating an infrastructure for implementation for the Fall. The Spring will be dedicated to development and approval with a Fall 2020 launch of micro-credentialing.

- Gregg Berninger, in his role as President of the Faculty Council, will lead a college-wide ad-hoc committee to review the process for committee selection, viability of current



committees (make recommendations for eliminations, establish a criterion for standing vs ad-hoc committee). Ensure every standing committee has a purpose and charge.

- As the library has transitioned to the new Alma and Primo system mandated by SUNY.
 There is need for additional training and workflow consultation for staff to maximize the effectiveness of the new system.
- Dr. Drummer sent an email to faculty asking for participation in open-house scheduled for October 19^{th,} so we can showcase why Columbia-Greene is the # 1 Community College in New York and the 10th best in the country! The intent is to use this opportunity to have faculty promote their programs and generate excitement with prospective students and their families.
- The College has submitted a Letter of Interest to the USDOE to apply as a participant in the Second Chance Pell Experimental Sites Initiative. If selected, we would be able to offer financial aid to identified populations within the prison community.

Vice President and Dean of Students and Enrollment Management, Joseph Watson reported:

Enrollment

- Admissions Applications and registered students that has translated to having more part-time than full-time students
- College in the High School/concurrent enrollment program, we are continuing to accept and register students.
- Zone Registrations and Late Registration occurred during the summer and faculty and staff met with over 80 students.
- Non-attending reporting is taking place right now and the faculty report to Registration, designating who are non-attenders in their classes.
- Daycare reports they have children and are gearing up for their payroll deduction donations and wreath fundraiser is coming up soon.

Recruitment & Outreach

- The Admission Staff have begun their fall recruitment season visiting high school and other recruitment events in the community. We have expanded our footprint beyond our two counties. This includes working with our academic and non-academic departments to achieve this.
- We were at the Columbia County Fair and sponsored "Friday Columbia-Greene Community College Day" and the Schoolgirl Queen pageant.
- Bangladesh Cultural Festival and the Greene County Youth Fair, as well as others.
- Saturday, October 19 Hope Rocks Open House Festival
