CAREER AND BUSINESS SKILLS

A to Z Grant Writing

This course provides students with the hands-on experience and knowledge they need to successfully begin the planning process for projects in need of grant funding. An approach to grant seeking begins with thinking about why the funding is needed and involving the grant applicant's stakeholders in the planning process. This course is self-paced; students have six weeks to complete the 24 course hours.

HVAC/R Certified Technician (Voucher Included)

Designed for students who have more than a year of HVAC/R experience, this course will prepare them for the next step—certification. HVAC/R technicians are in demand, but certified technicians can earn more and have better career opportunities. This online training course is designed to equip students with the knowledge and skills to maintain and troubleshoot complex heating, air conditioning, and refrigeration systems. Students will be provided with hands-on guidance through videos, reading assignments, service call simulations, and practical

applications. With content aligning to the latest industry standards, students will be prepared for the HVAC Excellence or NATE certification exams by the end of this course. They will also receive a voucher to take the HVAC Excellence exams. This course is self-paced; students have 12 months to complete the 330 course hours.

Standard First Aid/CPR/AED Course

This American Heart Association Standard First Aid Course provides individuals with the knowledge and skills necessary to recognize and provide basic care for injuries and sudden illnesses until medical personnel arrive. The course covers all required topics such as recognizing emergencies, prioritizing care, using or applying rescue breathing, administering adult CPR, and dressing wounds. The instructor will administer the American Heart Association First

Aid/CPR certificate exam at the end of the class. The certification earned for this course is valid for two years. Note: this class is not for professional recertification for EMT First Responders.

CERAMICS

Open Studio Ceramics

This Open Studio course is designed for adult ceramicists with intermediate to advanced skills who seek a flexible and self-directed environment to develop their personal practice and creative voice further. Participants will have access to a fully equipped ceramics studio to explore handbuilding, wheel throwing, sculptural techniques, glazing, and surface treatments at their own pace. Each student is provided with up to 50 lbs. of clay and access to studio glazes and firings. While this is a non-instructional format, the ceramics instructor is available during predetermined select hours for guidance on studio practices, demonstrations on technique, and providing a deeper understanding of clay/glaze material science. Open Studio access is available during Art Center hours. Access may be limited during the other noncredit class times. This offering is ideal for motivated makers but is not intended to support pottery production. Open studio members are required to help upkeep the cleanliness and safety of the studio and should contribute to studio maintenance.

Introduction to Pottery Wheel

Discover the art of throwing clay on the potter's wheel in this hands-on introductory course. With a maximum of five students, you'll receive personalized instruction over five weeks in a relaxed and supportive environment. Learn the fundamentals of centering clay, shaping basic

functional forms, trimming, and glazing your pieces. Approximately 25lbs of clay, access to studio glazes, and kiln firings are included. Hand tools are also included—bring your creativity and willingness to get a little messy! This course is the prerequisite for the Intermediate to Advanced wheel course, and is not intended for production pottery.

Intermediate to Advanced Pottery Wheel Throwing

Refine your potter's wheel throwing skills and expand your creative range in this hands-on ceramics class for intermediate to advanced students. Through focused instruction and individualized guidance, students will deepen their understanding of functional forms while exploring more complex techniques such as lidded vessels and larger wheel-thrown pieces. Emphasis will be placed on craftsmanship, consistency, and developing a personal creative style. This 5-week course is aimed at those with some wheel-throwing experience who want to refine their skills and is not intended to support production pottery. Materials of up to 25lbs of clay, studio glazes, tools, and kiln firings are included in the course and lab fees.

Basic concepts in form, texture, and surface design will be covered, and students will apply hand-building techniques to make projects of their choosing. No prior experience is required—just a willingness to get your hands dirty and have fun. Up to 25lbs of clay, studio glazes, tools and kiln firings are provided.

Jewish Baking: Making Babka *New!*

Line, mass, light source, and the use of negative space will be explored in a variety of exercises. Students will work with a range of mediums to enable the development of a full complement of techniques. (Model fee included.)
