



CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

SUNY AI for the Public Good Fellows, 2026-2027

The State University of New York is seeking SUNY faculty, instructional designers, and librarians who are content and/or pedagogical experts on the use of artificial intelligence for the public good and/or the ethical use of AI in instruction to serve as **SUNY AI for the Public Good Fellows**. The AI for the Public Good Fellows will support faculty, librarians, and instructional designers across SUNY who are developing or seeking to revise existing courses and develop other learning activities to fulfill the updated Information Literacy core competency of the SUNY General Education Framework.

Up to ten fellows will be selected for 2026-2027.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Provide support to SUNY faculty, librarians, and instructional designers who are developing or seeking to revise courses and to develop other learning activities that will fulfill the updated Information Literacy core competency of the SUNY General Education Framework. A priority focus for this year will be creating and curating teaching and learning activities and support for the ethical incorporation of AI tools in a diverse set of disciplines and majors.
- Host webinars for broader sharing of ideas.
- Contribute to a repository of instructional resources for the teaching and assessment of AI literacy.
- Host workshops and offer consultations upon campus and/or System Administration request.
- Facilitate conversation and collaboration among SUNY faculty, librarians, and academic support staff across campuses.
- Provide support for faculty and staff who are taking courses in the Google Career Certificate AI Essentials, for which campuses will be provided licenses through a partnership between SUNY System Administration and Google.
- Engage in service-oriented research, at the direction of the SUNY Office of Academic Affairs, on the incorporation of AI across the system
- Collaborate with other Academic Affairs Fellows to support intersections among the scope of responsibilities for each.

Minimum Qualifications

- Current SUNY full-time faculty, librarians, and instructional designers who will continue to be employed in the same position throughout the 2026-2027 academic year
- Must have been employed by SUNY in a full-time capacity for at least one year prior to the start date of the term
- Subject matter expertise to be able to fulfill the duties and responsibilities, as evidenced by graduate study, teaching and/or instructional design experience, publications, conference presentations, and workshops
- At least three years of teaching, leading workshops and information sessions, and/or course development experience with AI tools or with AI-embedded tools.
- Recognized knowledge and experience creating, implementing, managing, and supporting college-level curriculum, including but not limited to course content development, course administration, content delivery, material development, and assessment of student learning outcomes
- Exceptional communication skills with the ability to communicate complex ideas clearly and concisely to individuals and groups, both in writing and orally.
- Available for occasional travel across the state to support SUNY campuses

Preferred Qualifications

- Current SUNY alumni and/or fellows; from a low-income background (e.g., Pell-eligible as undergraduates); were first-generation college students (students whose parents have not earned a bachelor's degree); have overcome adversity; are AmeriCorps alumni; or are veterans.

Compensation

\$10,000.00 per fellow (\$5,000 per semester), distributed according to campus, SUNY, and state policies and procedures, with reimbursement for approved travel related to the Fellows program

- This Fellows program is not for research support; it is grounded in system-wide service.
- Past Fellows are welcome to apply.
- Those with pre-approved or planned leaves, such as a sabbatical leave, are not eligible for this program during the academic year when the leave will occur.
- Notifications anticipated on or about July 20, 2026.
- The appointments are expected to begin on or about August 24, 2026, and continue through May 31, 2027.
