



CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

SUNY Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Social Justice Fellows, 2026-2027

SUNY is pleased to announce an open call for applications for the fourth cycle of the [SUNY DEISJ Fellows](#) program to support DEISJ curricular work across the system. Faculty who meet the qualifications and reflect the diversity of disciplines, expertise, and institutions across the SUNY system are invited to apply for this service-based appointment. Up to ten fellows will be selected.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Develop an individual or collaborative project to support the teaching of DEISJ courses and topics
- Gather and amplify resources for the development and teaching of General Education DEISJ courses to provide support for faculty across various disciplines system-wide
- In coordination with the SUNY Office of the Provost, continue to survey the implementation of the DEISJ General Education requirement across the system and provide recommendations to the SUNY Office of the Provost
- Offer directed support to faculty and campuses for developing and teaching courses that meet the DEISJ General Education requirement
- Host regional workshops at community colleges to support the teaching of DEISJ
- Facilitate other workshops or offer consultations upon campus and/or System Administration request
- Participate in sustaining and growing a DEISJ community of practice
- Collaborate with other Academic Affairs Fellows Programs to support intersections among the scope of responsibilities for each

Minimum Qualifications

- Current SUNY full-time faculty, who will continue to be employed in the same position through the 2026-2027 academic year
- Must have been employed by SUNY in a full-time capacity for at least one year prior to the start date of the term
- At least three years of teaching and/or course development experience focused on diversity, equity, inclusion, and social justice
- Subject matter expertise and experience to be able to fulfill the duties and responsibilities, as evidenced by graduate study, teaching, publications, conference presentations, and workshops

- Exceptional communication skills with the ability to communicate complex ideas clearly and concisely to individuals and groups, both in writing and orally
- Available for occasional travel across the state to support SUNY campuses

Preferred Qualifications

- Experience in supporting the teaching of DEISJ topics at the community colleges or in STEM or applied degrees
- Scheduled to teach a DEISJ-designated course during the 2026-2027 academic year
- Experience with General Education curriculum approval and/or assessment
- A record of working with organizations and initiatives on campus and/or in surrounding communities that demonstrate commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion
- Current SUNY alumni and/or Fellows; from a low-income background (e.g., Pell-eligible as undergraduates); were first-generation college students (students whose parents have not earned a bachelor's degree); have overcome adversity; are AmeriCorps alumni; or are veterans

Compensation

\$10,000 per fellow (\$5,000 per semester), distributed according to campus, SUNY, and state policies and procedures, with reimbursement for approved travel related to the Fellows program.

- Review of applications will begin immediately.
- This Fellows program is not for research support; it is grounded in system-wide service.
- Past Fellows are welcome to apply.
- Those with pre-approved or planned leaves, such as a sabbatical leave, are not eligible for this program during the academic year when the leave will occur.
- Notifications anticipated on or about July 20, 2026.

- The appointments are expected to begin on or about August 24, 2026 and continue through May 31, 2027.
